

Thank you all for your donations on BigDoG.


Just think, if you donated the minimum of \$25, someone matched it and when you picked up your free bottle of wine and had your car washed free at

Rhoads School Report



LIVING HISTORY CLASSES: Our School year has ended and a busy one it was. There were several changes in the schedule, but staff rose to the occasion. We held 74 classes this year and we already have several dates reserved for the next school year.

POSITIONS: Unfortunately, one docent had to step down because of family conflicts so we are down to only five docents to handle the entire next school year. We are in desperate need of anyone who would like to be trained. They will be assigned to about ten classes a year lasting about 5-6 hours each for which they are paid. They don't need to be a retired teacher, just someone willing to learn and share the information.

REPAIRS: Volunteers and scouts are repairing or replacing rails, fences, and other things as needed, plus minor construction projects. This is one of the premiere programs and schools in the nation and we want to keep our little jewel in the park shinning.

RHOADS SCHOOL OPEN HOUSE: Every first Saturday of the month from 1:00 – 4:00 PM the school is open for FREE tours. Come see what classes were like in the 1890's. Look for the three new feather signs celebrating the day.


