

Call to Order: First Vice President Elaine Wright

- Sarah Johnson reported that a consultant has been selected to assist Old Town with historic preservation.
- Ruth Wightman presented a generous donation to the Society.
- Minutes of October 10 were approved as amended.
- Treasurer's Report was approved as submitted. Jim Entrican reported that our Treasurer, Jeanette Lawson, is in the hospital.
- The next General Meeting will be at Ray Baylas' Old Town Creations on November 21. John Maggy will present a cannonball believed to be from Jared Sheldon's cannon at the General Meeting.
- No Board meeting scheduled for December.
- Phil Teeters of the nomination committee read the second nomination of officers.
- Board approved spending \$315 to change the locks and security codes at the Hotel.
- Decorating for the Old Fashioned Christmas is on target and the Black Tie & Santa event was discussed.
- Docents are in place for the Old Town Dickens Faire on November 26.

- The Tree Ring scout project at the Rhoads School was very well done. Other Boy Scout Eagle projects were discussed.

Elk Grove Historical Society Landscape Project

A meeting has been scheduled for January 21, 10 AM, at the Hotel/Museum to discuss the landscaping project at the Elk Grove Historical Society. We are welcoming volunteers to attend the meeting to see what you can do to help with this final stage of landscaping.

Coffee, water, soft drinks, and donuts will be available for a morning snack.

Designer Michael Glassman has designed a plan to give the Hotel some "road appeal" that would make it a destination. He suggested replacing the chain link fence with a wrought iron one (this was recently completed). Vines of various types of roses would grow up the fence.

He also envisioned that inside the gate tall planter boxes of heirloom roses in various shades of pink would sync-up with the palatial design of the Hotel.

Glassman suggested a tall wrought-iron, standing water fountain in the middle of the front lawn.

More tall brick planter boxes with heirloom roses and foxglove would sit under the porch. Honey-suckle would grow up the banisters "for scent."

A cobblestone or gravel walkway would allow visitors to meander through the front area and enjoy the flowers and the sound of the fountain, or sit on one of the two white "old architectural" wrought iron benches.

We hope to make a time table for the different individual projects with an overview of what each of us has to do to make this project reach completion by 2013.



3 Day, 2 Night, stay in Luxury Condominiums Reserve by Jan 10, 2012

The Elk Grove Historical Society is sponsoring a snow train trip on Amtrak from Sacramento through the snow covered Sierras to Reno on March 13 through March 15, 2012.

Amtrak leaves Sacramento March 13 at 11:09 AM and arrives in Reno at 4:06 PM. Lunch is available in the dining car. Snacks & drinks are available at the Snack Bar. Or bring your own eats, drinks & snacks on board. The return trip will leave Reno March 15 at 8:36 AM and arrive in Sacramento at 2:13 PM.

Lodging for the two nights in Reno will be at the **WorldMark** condominiums at 250 N. Arlington Ave, within walking distance to the casinos. They also have a shuttle that runs every hour to the downtown casinos. The condos are 1 or 2 bedroom/bath units, with a fully furnished kitchen, dining area and TV/lounging area. The website for the property is www.WorldMarktheClub.com. On the website, click on Resort Gallery, then follow the links to Reno, Nevada. While this is a timeshare property, there will be no sales presentation. The units are being made available through a member's account at WorldMark.

While in Reno, you are free to enjoy the activities at the casinos that include **Circus Circus, Silver Legacy, ElDorado, Harrah's**, and **CalNeva**. Also the **Nevada Museum of Art** is about 6 blocks from the condominium.

The **National Automobile Museum** (formerly Harrah's Auto Museum) is also located about 6 blocks from the condominium. Along with its historic exhibit, this year they are featuring cars from the Burning Man event held each year on the Black Rock Desert in Nevada. The exhibit is titled "Mutant Rides: Origin of a Species". These rolling works of art are now deeply entrenched in the culture of Burning Man, a festival of radical self-expression that draws thousands to a temporary city created each year in the Northern Nevada desert.

On Wednesday March 14, at the Reno Events Center, there is the one night only **Blake Shelton Well Lit & Amplified Tour 2012.** Blake Shelton, reigning "Male Vocalist of the Year" and five-time CMA nominee including a nod for the most prestigious award, "Entertainer of the Year" with opening acts Justin Moore and NBC's "The Voice" finalist, Dia Frampton. Tickets range from \$25 to \$50, Telephone I-800-745-3000 to make reservations through Ticket Master for this optional activity. With "fees", 2 of the \$50 tickets to be emailed are \$128.65. Order quickly as concert sells out.

The price for the Amtrak train and condominium room for 2 nights is as follows:

Per person, double occupancy **\$200**. (Single supplement \$75, for a total of 275). Third & Fourth persons in a 2 bed/2 bath unit is **\$130** each.

Space is limited to 10 condominiums. **Make reservations now by calling Dennis Buscher at 714- 2355**. One half payment is due by January 14, with balance due by February 15.
