

Pictured on the left are the King's Chair and one of the many beautiful masquerade masks on display, and on the right are some of the handmade costumes used in the performances. There are replicas of the Schonbrunn Palace (pictured below), the Alpine Chalet designed by Arnie Zimbelman and constructed by Arnie and Ed Keema in 1995, and the Cinderella Castle designed by Ed Keema and constructed by Ed and Arnie Zimbelman in 1994. Rhoads School Report – Frances Fite



We may still be waiting for Winter, but the Rhoads School Schedule says it's almost Spring. We took our annual mid-winter break for the holidays, and also because our wonderful old building is harder to keep heated in the cold weather. Now classes have started up again, and it looks like a pretty full schedule well into May.

We have five full-time docents, plus a sometimes-available, Mistress Nellie St.Clair, who

became a Grandma last year and wants the time off. Each docent brings her own uniqueness to the teaching, and they are all great.

We also have a crew that we call 'the Fire-Builders', consisting of six individuals or couples. Five are responsible for a specific day of each week, with number six being the substitute, whenever needed. And so far he is a busy substitute. I assume that you can guess what the 'fire-builders' do. Yes, they arrive early and build a fire in the indoor stove, and then tend to it and any other custodial needs, and greet the docent when she arrives about an hour later. Like the docents, the Rhoads School Program couldn't happen without these people.
