

Established 1872

## Write it Down by Brookelea Lutton

As I follow the trail of the old prospector, Peter Voiss, the subject of my book, *Old Man of the Mountains*, I talk to many people at the events where I sell the book. I have attended events from Plumas County to Mariposa County, to Alpine, El Dorado and Placer Counties. As I tell my story, I become a student of my customers' local history. How proud they are of their little historical towns and so willing to share their own stories! Through their stories I have learned about the gold that remains buried under Oroville Dam from someone who worked on the dam project. Then there's the man who followed his hunch when he found the remains of a saloon in Plumas County. He figured that the miners would probably stand outside the saloon and throw their beer bottles away. So, he threw a stone and dug where it landed, and sure enough found some old bottles.

Another man told about a find in Virginia City. Years ago some miners had stashed some coins in a pipe, melted the end and folded it over, then buried it. Some digging had taken place and the school kids happened to be out on this particular day when they were told to go "remove that pipe over there." When they did so, it broke and out fell the coins from the 1800s. Apparently the miners had stashed the coins, then the mine closed and they were unable to ever retrieve them.

I show the old purse that my dad found in the rafters of a mine that contained Peter Voiss' writings. A woman in Placerville said she noticed a satchel lying on the ground at an old house she had once bought. Inside were five coins that were over 100 years old! Miners used to stash their money in those satchels (no money found in the one my dad found) and tie them in the trees. In this case, the tree had grown and the rawhide tie had broken, causing the satchel to fall to the ground. She had one of the coins made into a pennant necklace.

These interesting little stories are locked in their owner's memories and experiences. Who's going to know about these fragments of history if they aren't written down? Are you writing your stories down?


### Old Business:

- A site plan is needed for the Native American Interpretive Center. CCSD and Russell Newland will remove brick debris from site to clean up location. Native plants will be planted in the area.
- Generations' staff gave a great presentation and hands-on guided research for beginners in the use of Ancestry.com at the Elk Grove Library.

### New Business:

- Discussed possibly changing our newsletter from monthly to bimonthly or quarterly to save on costs. Further discussion is needed before a vote. To be carried over for the next meeting.
- Lighting is needed at the front gate and along the walkway at the entrance to the Museum. Also, lighting is needed in the stairwell. Storage space on the property is needed once we work on the Folks' House.
- Phil Teeters nominated, and the Board approved, Norman Franklin as President of the Elk Grove Historical Society.
