Eagle Project for Troop 59 - Refurbish Flagpole

Is This Building in Old Elk Grove Haunted?



Elk Grove Paranormal Investigations was called upon to investigate claims of strange noises heard by current and former employees of the old Masonic Hall/Mercantile Building on Elk Grove Boulevard. - Discussion of the purchase of a Miwok basket for \$600 for permanent display will be continued.
- Possible future exhibit would be the oldest Boy Scout Troup in Elk Grove, #59. Would invite other troops to display memorabilia.
- The Generations\Research Library will sell historic Elk Grove photos for display in the upcoming Five Star Bank on East Stockton Blvd.
- The Native Americans were added to the membership and will be mailed a dues bill this month.
- Following the Spring Tea on May 7, the hotel will open at 2 PM. Holly Turnbull will ensure docents are present to help guests.
- During "Spotlight at the Ranch" on June 12th, several additional docents are needed. Jim Entrican will forward names and email addresses to Elizabeth Pinkerton.
- Lorraine Croup asked everyone to save unwanted items for the yard sale July 15-17. She will be available to accept donations at the hotel beginning Saturday, July 9th.
