



Rhoads School Established 1872

Rhoads School Report

The Rhoads School will end it's 2012-2013 year on May 29, at which time a total of 57 school classes will have had the chance to experience going to

school in the 1890s. With the teaching of our 6 excellent docents (schoolmarms) this experience is truly wonderful. The children become children of so many years ago, in dress, in deportment, in having classes such as calligraphy, manners, recess games of long ago, etc.

Requests for the 2013-2014 school year will begin to come in in September, as public school schedules are established, and the Rhoads School program will begin again in October. It has been a fine year.

Frances Fite Steps Down from Rhoads School

Effective June 1, 2013 Merry Leverton will take the reigns as Superintendent of the Rhoads School as Frances Fite steps down from her role begun along with her late husband Bob in 1995. As Superintendent of the 1872 school, Merry will meet with Sacramento County schools to discuss the opportunity for classes to attend a Living History Day at the Rhoads School. On this day students experience a "day at school in the 1890s." Each visiting class is taught by a Schoolmarm Docent. The Rhoads School's functions are administered by the Elk Grove Historical Society, through a group of volunteers known as the Rhoads School Board. Welcome, Merry!

EGHS Board Meeting Minutes - April 8, 2013

Call to order: EGHS President Barbara Claire

- Barbara introduced Merry Leverton who is the new Director of the Rhoads School beginning June 1, 2013.
- Barbara passed around an article in the Citizen written by Elizabeth Pinkerton about Dennis Buscher.
- Minutes of March II were approved as corrected. Jeanette presented several bills to be paid, which the Board approved. The Treasurer's report was approved as submitted.

Committee Reports

- Antique and Craft Show Seven vendors have submitted applications to date.
- Cookbook So far 39 pre-orders have been received. The cookbook should be printed within the next two
 weeks.
- Haunted House The Board previously approved an expenditure of \$2,500 for "Elk Grove's Haunted House" plus whatever we can get in donations (\$900 so far). Jeanette proposed sending a "Phantom Ball" letter to solicit further donations. Jim has submitted a grant to the City of Elk Grove for police officers to cover the event.
- Membership Jim has printed mailing labels for Lorraine to send reminder letters to those who have not paid dues.
- Spring Tea Pam Phelps reported that 96 tickets have been sold so far. Lorraine Croup will be our emcee.
- Old Fashioned Christmas—Jeanette proposed that we not solicit decorators as we have in the past. It is very
 difficult to get them and she feels that the Society can take on this responsibility. She will assign people to
 decorate each room. If needed, a \$100 stipend will be provided for additional decorations for each room. We
 received \$1,300 in donations last year and we need to sell more Black Tie tickets. She discussed her proposed
 budget which the Board approved.

Unfinished Business

- Front Landscaping and Walkway Lighting Jim received \$260 from Scout Connor Edwards, which he solicited in donations. Jim would like to use this to purchase more hydrangeas. Jim would also like to purchase a shop vacuum to clean the fountain, cost estimated to be \$50-\$150. Board approved this expenditure.
- Foulks House Restoration—Jim has received nothing from the architect and learned there was a fire in their
 office and the plans were destroyed. They will need to be redrawn. He will keep us apprised as the deadline
 approaching.

Storage Shed - A Boy Scout will take this on as a project and approval from CSD has been received.


Grant Submission - The Grant submitted to the City for funds to restore the Foulks House was not approved.

New Business

- Barbara has asked Sally Bergen, and she has agreed, to take on the responsibility of checking e-mails sent to the Society.
- Carol Fischlin suggested that the community do something to recognize Louis Baroni's service as the last Constable of Elk Grove. Jim said the Chief of Police would be the person to contact.

President Barbara Claire adjourned the meeting.
