

Rhoads School Established 1872

The Rhoads School has experienced a flurry of activities recently. In September the American Legion held their annual meeting at the school yard. On September 21 the Elk Grove Historical Society hosted the general membership meeting at the school. This was a lot of fun because six former Rhoads School students attended and answered questions about what it was like attending a one room school. It was a very informative meeting and enjoyed by all. During the Giant Pumpkin Festival the school was open to the public on Saturday and Sunday. We welcomed over 200 visitors to the school. Many had never been inside the school. Everyone enjoyed seeing what it was like to be in a one room school. Thanks to all the board members who helped prepare the school for these visits. Special thanks to Don Baker, Wally Stropp & Jim Entrican who spent hours power washing the exterior and cleaning up the yard.

This year we have 70 classes scheduled to visit the Rhoads School Living History Program. We are excited for the children to take a step back in time to learn what school was like over 100 years ago. We hear over and over again from visitors that this field trip is one they always remember. We are grateful to those with the vision to move this beautiful old building to Elk Grove Park and restore her back to her original beauty. It has been nearly 40 years since the school was restored and dedicated. We will soon celebrate the 40th Anniversary on this dedication. 

EGHS Board Meeting Minutes - October 12, 2015

Call to order: The meeting was called to order by President Brookelea Lutton.

Public Comment: Brookelea introduced new members Louis Silveria and Leo Fassler.

Approval of Minutes: September 14, 2015--Diane Borden (Recording Secretary): Minutes approved.

Treasurer's Report/Bills--Jeanette Lawson (Treasurer): Reimbursements: Lorraine Croup for Lodi bus trip, \$1,036.03; Barbara Claire for grant purchases of software, printer & ink - \$1,388.00 and \$1,005.00. We will be reimbursed by the grantee; Deanna Reaves, decorations for the bathroom (no receipt) - \$28.40. Bills: SMUD - \$242.57. Approval to have the Museum cleaned by Merry Maids after Haunted Stage Stop - \$335.00

<u>CSD Update</u>—Rich Lozano: The biggest pumpkin for the contest weighed about 1,809 pounds. Everything went well and attendance was good. They are waiting for final insurance settlement for the Administration Building.

Reports: Claudia has responded to a call from a relative of the Bilby family, who will send us the wedding garments of her grandparents, as well as other memorabilia.

Unfinished Business:

Foulks House Restoration and Storage—Jim Entrican: Jim and Dennis have received and reviewed the plans from the Architect for the shed. Cement work has been committed to for the pad. The plan is to build a loft for extra storage and have the building insulated and eventually run some electricity for lights. He is estimating a budget of approximately 30,000 for a 20×25 foot shed, and through donations of materials. We will have to pay for the cost of labor of a licensed contractor. Forms need to be put in and rebar so the cement can be poured. He requested approval for a tentative budget to get started. It was moved by Jeanette Lawson and seconded by Jim Entrican to approve up to 30,000 to build the storage unit. The motion carried with a vote of 5 yes and 2 no.

<u>Scout Projects</u>—Jim Entrican: Eagle Scouts will extend the brickwork walkway at the Rhoads School in the front area by the gate and replace the slate memorial squares (about 10). Two projects were completed last month and there are 11 in the works.

Bus Tour of Winery and Rae House in September—Lorraine Croup: We made about \$1,117.00 from the tour and raffle that Sally put together. Everyone that went really enjoyed the day.

Reese School Committee—Brookelea Lutton/all: Montgomery Construction has received our check (\$6,500) for payment in full for the steel beams and cribbing as noted on their invoice. Jim received an e-mail today from Architect Kevin Pressey saying that the Reese school building is "unique" and there are not very many left in California. He believes that every effort should be made to maintain the building and the key elements should be made so that when funds are available the building could be restored. The firm has offered to help with the architectural and structural design to lower the building off of the cribbing and set the building on a foundation and to help describe the best way to preserve the historic detail until funds can be raised to fully restore the structure. Project on hold until after the first of the year.

New Business: Slate of Officers for 2016—Lorraine Croup: Merry announced the following nominations: President Brookelea Lutton, Ist Vice President Claudia Johnson, 2nd Vice President Dennis Buscher, Recording Secretary Diane Borden, Corresponding Secretary Sally Bergen, Treasurer Jeanette Lawson.

Louis Silveria said he would be willing to help with the newsletter. We also need to consider appointing an assistant for Jeanette Lawson who can be her back up and/or be trained to do the job.

Foulks Story—Jim Entrican: Jim would like us to consider compiling a book about the Foulks family based on diaries that Mike Lynn, a Native Son of the Golden West, has transcribed and typed. He is a great grandson of Guy Foulks. It was agreed this would be a good fundraiser for our projects.

Big Day of Giving, May 3rd—Brookelea Lutton: Dennis Buscher volunteered to help Louis Silveria.

Dennis Buscher has made some metal signs to place on the property in recognition of the many flowers that Big Oak Nursery has donated to us. Sally will also send them a thank you letter.

The meeting was adjourned by President Brookelea Lutton at 5:45 PM.
