

EGHS Board Meeting Minutes - August 11, 2014

Call to Order: EGHS President Barbara Claire

- Minutes of July 14 were approved as submitted.
- Net profit for the Annual Yard Sale was \$6,362.44.
- Approved \$50 for remainder of this year and \$100 for all of next year for decorating the bathrooms. Our Volunteer Deanna is doing a great job cleaning and decorating the bathrooms.
- Treasurer's report was approved as submitted.

Rhoads School--Painting is moving slowly; some of the books that were moved are in poor shape and should probably be tossed. Native Sons have committed a \$1,000 donation for scholarships.

Committee Reports:

- Annual Yard Sale Lorraine was extremely happy with the results of this fundraiser and complimented how professional our volunteers were. The canopies were a big improvement.
- Annual Antique and Craft Show We've received 38 vendor applications and expect more. Pinkberry will be coming with their frozen yogurt and will donate 20% of their sales to us.
- By-Laws The By-Laws are being updated. There was discussion on some of the proposed updates and the Board provided clarification.
- Giant Pumpkin Festival & Haunted Stage Stop--We will have a booth for the Festival in the Park and will need volunteers every day. Flyers will be given to CSD for the schools. If anyone knows of high school students that would be interested in helping, please let Jeanette know. We were approved for a \$1,000 grant from the City, but it has not been received yet. Jim will follow up.
- Membership--We received 4 new applications as a result of the Yard Sale and we've received some past-due dues.
 We've received a \$250 donation from El Dorado Savings Bank.

Unfinished Business:

- Foulks House Restoration and Blacksmith Shop/Storage Shed--The cement and pad can be done for the blacksmith shop; it will need to be inspected. Board approved sending out a flyer for a "Barn Raising" event to solicit donations to get started.
- Reese School Committee--We are waiting on the architect to draw up plans. Dennis will follow up.
- Front Porch Repair--Jim thinks a Boy Scout can take care of this. He will also provide a list of other maintenance issues.

New Business:

- Calendar Idea: Sally has suggested we make a calendar to sell that will have photos for each month taken at different places in appropriate attire.
- Donations-- Elizabeth Pinkerton has offered to donate some of her things to us; we will arrange a meeting.
- IPad (\$499) or Mini IPad (\$399) for Visa sales: We will consider and vote on purchasing one to leave onsite to use for credit sales.
- Whitelock Parkway Meeting--Historical Society representative will attend this meeting on Sept. 3.
- T-Shirts for Volunteers: All of the shirts have been given out. Discussion whether we should order more. Barbara will check into cost and let the Board know.

President Barbara Claire adjourned the meeting.
