

Inside the Museum Files:

Elk Grove Movie Theatre

The Carl Amundson family moved to Elk Grove in 1946. Ord Leachman built the Cow/Cattle Palace Cattle Yard at the end of Webb Street in 1948. Carl started showing movies in the auction building on December 7, 1949 until 1954. Inside the theater, Amundson installed 500 theater seats and six wagon wheel chandeliers. Only 45 minutes was required for two men to change the building from an auction pavilion to a theater. After moving the seats onto the floor, the screen was then lowered into place and the curtains were drawn. On February 4, 1955 they built a new theatre on Elk Grove Boulevard that was again run by the whole family. In 1959 the Amundsons sold the theatre to Jerry & Esther Brown and Ben and Wilma DeWald who showed movies until 1965 when they sold it to the Assemby of God who converted it to a church. They held services their until 1977 when it partially burnt in January. Parishioners continued services at Joseph Kerr while looking for a buyer. It was in escrow when it burnt down six months later in May of 1977, which the fire department declared it as "suspicious." It was bought by a Sacramental business firm and was converted to a small business center in 1978 that is still in use today. It is on the corner of Williamson Drive and is now used by Enterprise Car Rental, a mailing store, and a dentist.

Dismantling of the Reese School

The school is in such bad condition it is almost ready to fall down. We have accumulated \$150,000 for restoration, but the latest estimate says it will be at least \$300,000 to just put the front part on a foundation. For complete restoration we are talking double and maybe triple that amount. It has taken us 11 years to just earn that amount after we saved for

the Foulks House restoration. The worry is we think the school is very close to falling down and we have run out of time. We wanted you to know we are beyond hope, it has become unsafe, and we are giving up our dream of restoration. We are so sorry.
