# Foulks House

The Foulks House was moved to the Historical Society's Heritage Park in 2006. It has taken almost 14 years to have plans approved with historical permits, taking bids, raise funds, and then starting restoration. It has finally been completed, well almost. We still have a few more inside projects to be completed by the summer of 2020.

A lot of research has gone in to trying to keep it as historically correct, yet meet current day safety requirements. It was a struggle, but we think our efforts were worth it.

When it is all finished we plan on using it as a Foulks family museum. We were lucky enough to have saved some actual Foulks family heirlooms, plus some period furniture. We are open every first Saturday of the month (Feb-Oct), so come take a look.
