Inside the Museum Files:

The First Elk Grove Bank Robbery

On Monday, July 16, 1928 the Elk Grove branch of the Security Bank and Trust in Elk Grove (middle photo) was robbed of \$8,200 by two masked bandits brandishing weapons. It was the second robbery in four days by the same crew. Four days earlier, Tuesday, July 12, the Bank of Courtland was robbed of \$10,000.

Wearing handkerchiefs over their mouth and in greasy coveralls they went about the robbery in military precision while a third waited in a car outdise. Charles H. Copper, manager of the bank, George Tavernar, member of the board of directors, and William

Smith, teller (left photo) were first taken behind one of the bank cages, where Tavernar was forced to turn over the keys to the cash drawer.

They escaped in a Sacramento man's stolen car (right photo). The three headed toward the park where a fourth person was waiting in another car. Two men from the bank followed them, but ran out of gas just before they got to them. The bandits were seen driving toward Stockton, but the police believe they will circle around to their lair

believed to actually be in Sacramento.


