

1952 ~ 1957 Turbovsky





Elk Grove Historical Society Board Meeting February 16, 2009

- Call to order: President Jim Entrican
- Reading of Minutes: Minutes of the January 26, 2009
 General Board Meeting read by Sue Richter Amended
 by President Jim Entrican to include a motion to pay for
 supplies for the May Tea Party.
- Treasurer's Report: Read by Jeanette Lawson, the report was discussed and passed. Bills to be presented: Dennis Buscher presented a bill for work done for the Luttig Memorial Garden for \$1,009.92. He also gave a breakdown of expenditures. The bill was approved for payment. Dennis Buscher then donated \$700 from his Germany Trip and also had collected a \$240 donation for the roses in the Luttig Memorial Garden.
- Committee Reports: Lucille reported information about the next four General Meetings. The Insurance for Historical Meetings is covered for the rest of this year. Anita Peters said that 64 tickets of 160 tickets had sold already for the Spring Tea. Advertisement for this event was discussed. President Jim Entrican spoke of his visit to Roy Herberger's facility and also his good work in contacting other local news agencies. Liz Sellstrom talked about the April car show and the fire inspection and fire extinguishers that are needed for that event. She already has flyers out for this event. Archivist Report: Liz Sellstrom told of Popsicle Charlie's donation of a painting and called for volunteers for docents for March 7th at the Hotel and for cleaning the Hotel before the opening. Elaine Wright reported about Rhodes School. New rose bushes have been planted around the building and funds for the new handicapped ramp were discussed extensively. Ed Keema volunteered to do a new sign for the Rhoads School.
