

Rhoads School Established 1872

The fall semester of the Rhoads School Program was a short one, as always. Each year it goes from the beginning of October through early November. The weather is usually dependable during that time. and outside activities are possible. After that beginning, there are no classes for the balance of November, during December, or January. It is too cold, and especially too dark, since the school has no lights.

School visits begin again in February, and are steady through the middle of May. This year, there are already nearly 60 classes that are scheduled, with perhaps more to come.

For our readers who do not know what the Rhoads

School Program consists of, it is basically a whole school day at Rhoads, going to school as children of the 1890s. The students wear clothing typical of what children of that era wore, and the docent will look like a traditional 'stern schoolmarm', usually in a long black skirt, highnecked blouse, and a severe hair style.

Lessons are the usual ones of that era, with *Hygiene*, *History*, *Reading* (from McGuffey Readers), *Arithmetic* (with slates and chalk), and a *Spelling Bee*. At recess, among the activities are *Jacks*, *Marbles*, *Jump Rope*, *Rolling Hoops*, *Walking on Stilts*, and the usual group games of olden days.

The students get so into their role playing that some of the classroom teachers say that it takes them a week back in their regular classroom to give up their pioneer names.


