
#### "Mammoth Tooth"

In April of 1959, workers were excavating for a drainage sump on the Brooks Hop Ranch on Grantline Road. The crew reported broken bones and officials were called. There were artifacts but one item measuring 12 inches across and weighing 15 pounds was found to be a tooth from a wooly mammoth and believed to be over 1,000,000 years old.

#### Barbara Claire

Barbara was born in Black River Falls, Wisconsin in March 1951, 10th of 11 children. Her birth name

She loved attending, almost daily to do gardening on the grounds, planting flowers, pulling weeds, etc. around 2009 to 2017 when she moved.

For 2021's Old Fashion Christmas, Barbara will be doing the Markofer bedroom to the 12 days of Christmas theme – 7 Swans a Swimming.

For years, Barbara did most of the flyers for advertising and events, made programs for the bus trips, created displays at the administration building of the Elk Grove Unified School District for their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, created a large family tree including all the different school districts (dating back to the 1800s) that eventually became part of Elk Grove Unified. She helped with several historical society publications as co-author or just publisher. Currently, Barbara is the EGHS Society Publisher, Assistant Treasurer, Webmaster and online Store Manager. She is also 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President of the CRC Patrons Club. Her education, talents, experience, hobbies, interests etc. definitely expand much further than this full page can accommodate!!

## JAMES HALL ELK GROVE HOUSE FOUNDER OF ELK GROVE

JAMES W. HALL, HIS WIFE SARAH, SONS JOHN, HENRY, THOMAS, WILLIAM AND DAUGHTER ANNE TRAVELED WEST FROM MCHENRY COUNTY ILLINOIS TO HANGTOWN (NOW PLACERVILLE) WITH THE UPPER MISSISSIPPI OX COMPANY. AFTER TRAVELING OVER 2000 MILES THEY ARRIVED AROUND SEPTEMBER 9, 1850, THE DAY THAT CALIFORNIA WAS ADMITTED TO THE UNION. FROM HANGTOWN, THE HALL FAMILY CHOSE TO SETTLE FIFTEEN MILES SOUTH OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO. HERE THEY BUILT A TAVERN AND NAMED IT "ELK GROVE HOUSE", WHICH BECAME A STAGE STOP BETWEEN SUTTER'S FORT AND MONTEREY. ON MAY 13, 1854, JAMES HALL WAS APPOINTED POSTMASTER OF THE ELK GROVE POST OFFICE. LIKE SO MANY PIONEERS COMING TO CALIFORNIA SEEKING GOLD, HE AND HIS FAMILY HELPED THE INFANT STATE OF CALIFORNIA TO DEVELOP AND PROSPER.








### **Civil War Days**

"Sonoma State Graduate Student, Amber Tedrow, completed her thesis project on the Odd Fellows historic Hilltop Cemetery using ground-penetrating radar to search for unmarked graves. She has been trying to shed light on gaps in the history of the cemetery and who may belong to any of the unmarked graves. She gave results that were both revealing and interesting."




