# "The Ryde Hotel"

Whether it was for excellent food and lodging or for tall stories of a downstairs Speakeasy, the reputation of the Ryde Hotel spread and wafted on the Delta breezes for miles either way! Pleasure boats came in by droves; the Delta King and Delta Queen made this port a regular stop. The forty hotel rooms and six private dining rooms were in great demand for overnight guests.

Oldtimers say this was not where the action was! Much more excitement was brewing beneath the hotel where "Speakeasy" was the word. Entrance was only gained by knowing the ropes or the correct password. Here was a great casino and dance hall with slot machines banging away; the bar doing a land office business. Packaged bottles of whiskey were sold from a "revenuer-proof" room.





# WAYNE GALLUP

Wayne Gallup has always been fascinated by history and can trace ancestors back to England on one side and Germans from Russia on the other. His Father came from a ranching family in Arbuckle, was a WWI horse artillery veteran, and later was a noted Catskinner. His Mother was a poet, writer, and Elk Grove Citizen Columnist. She preserved a lot of area history.

Wayne and his parents came to Wilton in 1937. He attended the old Dillard School, Elk Grove High School ('52). After attending U. C. Berkeley, he was drafted into the Army. This was near the end of the Korean War, and he was assigned to a top-secret experimental unit. There is no record of him ever having been there. He survived with minor injuries and a changed life. He would never again work in a job where he couldn't choose to walk away and would never work for someone he couldn't respect.

With an Honorable Discharge, Wayne returned to Graduate School at California College of Arts and Crafts... '58 to '62. He worked as an Illustrator, Graphic Designer, Design Director, and taught classes at Diablo Valley College. Tired of politics, he retired, and was immediately hired by the Public Employees Union he belonged to.

He worked there for several years as a Business Agent and Contract Negotiator. After several years politics again became an issue, and he retired once more.

In the meantime, circumstances led to Civil War reenacting. For ten years his Unit was the 7th Michigan Volunteer Cavalry, Custer's



command at Gettysburg, 1863. It was a wonderful experience...camaraderie, history, action, teaching.... but with safety as the main consideration. At the end of a battle, the guns would fall silent. In the hush, a trumpeter would blow "Recall". The dead would arise, brush themselves off, and acknowledge the cheering spectators. Appreciation!!

In 2005 Wayne and his Wife, Gretchen, moved back to the Ranch he grew up on. They have horses, peacocks, and chickens, all with names. Life is good.




