"ELK GROVE FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA"

Passage of the Smith-Hughes Vocational Education Act in 1917 not only provided federal funds to states for high school courses in vocational education (agriculture/family and consumer sciences/trades/industries, etc.) but it also led to the idea for an organization that is known today as the National FFA Organization.

Elk Grove FFA chapter was founded in 1929 with twelve members. In its early years, Elk Grove FFA had a reputation of producing outstanding young farmers who returned to the family farm. In the last thirty years, the program's emphasis has been on developing students' leadership skills, community service involvement, personal growth and career success in whatever occupation they choose to pursue. Within the previous 5 years, over 90% of AG Department graduates have continued onto college.

Within the previous thirty years, Elk Grove FFA has consistently been one of the top 5 chapters in the state of Californial This is measured by the academic success of students as well as awards won by students and teachers in the department. Total State FFA Degree recipients – 1255, State Proficiency Awards – 39, American Farmer Degree recipients – 129 and State Championship Teams – 74! Elk Grove FFA holds the record for the number of State Degrees in one year (2006-2007) – 80! Elk Grove FFA has also produced over 20 State Degree recipients for 20 consecutive years! 


