## "Covered Wagon"



Ken and Suzanne Jones donated an actual, real life, authentic covered wagon to the historical society. They purchased it from a family in 2011 in Springville, California. The Jones are downsizing and moving out of the area and wanted it to go to a good home where it would be appreciated. We are delighted!

Originally, it was brought to California by a relative of a Civil War General in the 1800's or early 1900's when the family moved to California from Virginia. It was used on their farm. Previous owner, Gail Inman from Visalia used to ride it in the Highway 50 Wagon Train (approximately 30 years ago), but it has not been driven since 2007.

Like any historical item that comes to the historical society, historian Dennis Buscher is researching and gathering documentation and genealogy for our files. It has been restored and is in excellent condition. It is on display, and we are working on a permanent structure to protect it year-round. It took a year to refurbish and was dedicated on July 4<sup>th</sup>, 1977. It now serves as museum and where Living History Classes are held throughout the year.



# Stage Stop Spotlight

Highlighting and appreciating our many volunteers

## Jim Luttig Volunteer and Special Agent

"Born in February of 1951 at Mercy Hospital in Sacramento and grew up in Franklin township during the 1950's and 1960's. My early years in Franklin were busy punching a cash register at the family-owned Luttig's Market (100 years in the family). I also was a fixture at King's Roller Rink, so much so, they gave me my first "Law Enforcement" job as Floor Manager at age 15. The King family used a little psychology on me because it made me, and my buddies behave and slow down out on the floor. Being around the "Mom and Pop Grocery" atmosphere during my formative years, I knew I wanted to do something a little more challenging and adventurous. After attending local schools and graduating from Elk Grove High in 1969 I moved on to Sacramento City College (1971) and Sacramento State class of 1973. After obtaining my Criminal Justice degree I went on to a 41-year career (1975-2016) in Law Enforcement with 21 of those years (1980-2001) as a Special Agent with the United States Secret Service. As a USSS agent I traveled the world with permanent assignments in Sacramento, Los Angeles, San Jose and San Francisco. My most coveted assignment was during my 1984 to 1988 years on the Presidential Protection Division at the White House with President Ronald Reagan. After the Secret Service career, I completed another 14 years as a Supervising Agent with the Inspector General's Office for the Social Security Administration in San Francisco combating Criminal Fraud against the agency. Currently and since 2001, I have been married to my wife Lauren and reside in the Fab Forties area of East Sacramento. We have a son, John who lives with his wife Heidi in Reno, Nevada. Elk Grove has grown and expanded enormously during the past 40-50 years. As a result, it is important that our newer residents are aware of some of the early history and pioneer families who made Elk Grove such a beautiful and prosperous area. I really enjoy volunteering and giving back to the Historical Society since our extended family has been in the Franklin/Elk Grove area since the 1860's. I also volunteer my time with the California Railroad Museum and the California Highway Patrol and belong to several civic organizations in the Sacramento area." - Jim
