#### Inside the Museum Files:

# Librarian Harriet G. Eddy

Miss Eddy was born in Lexington, Michigan, in 1876, obtained her teaching credential, and started her teaching career in Montana. In 1906 she came to California and was appointed principal of Elk Grove High School. She served as the first female principal in the State of California for four years. Unfortunately, students had to attend Sacramento High School for one more year to be accredited. The first year she was able to get the 4 senior students accredited. In the second year the attendance doubled. In her third year she was able to get EGHS accredited by meeting educational criteria and developing a library. The library was in an area of the school until it got so big that the (W.C.T.U.) Women's Christian Temperance Union donated a room in their building next door (Present day Grange Hall where a plaque is displayed on an outside wall.) and Miss Eddy used her \$5 monthly pay as custodian to procure tables and chairs. Miss Eddy developed a library system that was noticed by State Librarian James L. Gillis and she was asked to join his staff. For the next nine years she organized library systems in 40 of the 48 counties in California. She excelled and became a professor and retired in 1941, but not before she was invited to the Soviet Union as a consultant to the Ministry of Education in 1927. She spent ten months working out a program for their unification, modeled after the system she developed in the USA. She did the same for Yugoslavia. After retirement, she supported any organization purposed to bring peace between all nations. She died in 1966 in Napa at 90 years old. It is unmeasurable the influence she has had in educations, not only here, but in the world.

# Sally Bergen

Sally was born in Boise, Idaho in 1940 and grew up in Seattle, Washington. Ultimately, she earned her BS in Nursing and worked in Seattle, Eugene, and Berkeley, she then met and married Frank Bergen in the 70's and they moved to Sacramento where Frank worked for the State. After working in Critical Care for several years and teaching it at several hospitals, she decided it was time to open her own business and earned her MBA in Health Services Administration. She traveled to hospitals around the country as computers and specialized equipment where being initiated and medical staff needed guidance. She later remarried David Allen, and they traveled this country and Europe in between obligations. She worked with Kaiser Permanente hospitals implementing change in nursing care teams and conducting continued Education programs, including U.S. nurses in Mexico for 20 years. When she and Dave moved to Elk Grove in 2000, she retired. Throughout her career she has supported many nonprofit organizations by volunteering and in some cases, serving on boards. She worked Project Ride for 10 years, the Elk Grove Food Bank, and when Dave passed, the Elk Grove Historical Society. She planned bus trips, decorated the museum, chaired the Spring Tea, worked the Yard Sale and Santa's area during an Old Fashion Christmas, among many other aspects of the historical society. 
