## "Who Will Love My Children?"



In 1983 a made-for-television-biographical movie was made based on the life of Lucile Fray a farm wife from Iowa. Lucile was diagnosed with cancer in 1952 and wanted to find a suitable home for her ten children, since she felt her husband Ivan couldn't take care of them. The movie stared Ann Margaret as Lucile Fray and Fredric Forest as husband Ivan.

It was originally broadcast on February 14, 1983. On the same evening, the actual children of Lucile Fray appeared on an ABC program called, "That's Incredible!"

Interestingly, they filmed parts of the movie in Elk Grove. The east side of the tracks in Old Town were strewn with old 40's and 50's parked cars. Lucile drove up to the old Bank of America (Next to the new present day Old Town Plaza), got out, and walked into the building that was made to look like an office on the outside.

On the west side of the tracks, the Odd Fellows building (Present day School of Rock) was used as a bus stop where Lucile got off with some of the children. Soleil Moon Frye and Tracey Gold played two of the ten children.




