Inside the Museum Files:

Elk Grove's 1st Theatre



Elk Grove has had two theatres. The first, called the Cow Palace Theatre, was in a cattle auction building at the end of Webb Street in Old Town Elk Grove. Ord Leachman opened the cattle yard in 1948 and the Amundson family had their opening night on December 7, 1949. Carl Amundson said, "At night it was a theatre and during the day it was an auction."

The theatre consisted of 500 theatre seats and six wagon wheel chandeliers. Only 45 minutes was required for two men to change the building from an auction pavilion to a theatre. After moving the seats onto the floor, the screen was lowered into place and the curtain was drawn.

It was open Wednesday through Sunday with one showing at 6:30 pm every day (except Sundays, which was 2:00 pm) The evening consisted of two full length movies, a cartoon, and a newsreel. They used to say, you could smell the Westerns! Of course, there were refreshments to purchase in the auction yard Wagon Wheel café. Adults-60 cents, Juniors-50 cents, Children under 12-20 cents, and family night-\$1.

The movie theatre closed in 1954 when the Amundson's built their new Boulevard Theatre on Elk Grove Boulevard. Look for that story in the nest Stage Stop Gazette.
