


Frog Jumping Jubilee

A story was written by Mark Twain during his 88-day stay in Calaveras in 1865. It launched his international career. In short, Twain overheard bartender Ross Coon at the Angels Hotel tell the whopping tale of a jumping frog contest. According to the yarn, a hustler named Jim Smiley claimed he trained a frog to make long leaps on command. Smiley bet a stranger that his frog could out jump any other. The stranger took the bet but secretly fed Smiley's frog a handful of buckshot.

Smiley in return could not make his frog leave his spot, and the bet was lost.

Calaveras County has kept the spirit of Smiley and his frog "Daniel Webster" alive by celebrating the Jumping Frog Jubilee on the third weekend in May, ever since 1928.








Thursday, May 1



The Guy Foulks plaque just outside the museum gate was chiseled off and stolen. CSD has informed us that 13+ plaques have been stolen off benches and other spots throughout the park. Also, the Murphy Corral historical landmark plaque has been stolen. The thefts have been reported, but not sure of costs to replace them or who will. The Guy Folks plaque at the museum was erected in 1965 and The Murphy Corral plaque was placed in 1959. This is very sad.


