### "Monty" Emergency Messenger



"Del Cann (1866-1948) became Elk Grove's 1st volunteer Fire chief, and 1st appointed Constable of the San Joaquin Township - services which he held for a long time. He had a special "messenger".... Monty was a handsome, intelligent, coal black Cocker Spaniel who did his job with total willingness because he loved Del and Mrs. Cann. Monty always showed deep concern when the phone in the fire house rang, and no one answered. His job then was to find Del as soon as possible. He went home to Mrs. Cann who talked to the operator and received the phone call. Mrs. Cann wrote the message down, placed it in a special container on Monty's collar and sent him to find Del. Monty was known to all the personal of the established businesses in town, so they knew he carried a message for Del. Monty didn't stop searching until he completed his mission. Sadly, one day the eventide Monty was on his way to find Del he was accidently hit by a volunteer fireman. Monty died in Del's arms and later was buried in Mrs. Cann's rose garden by those who loved him." - Information by granddaughter Ouida Hanks


### Rhoads School Report


